Preserved Community Space

Woodhouse Farm is home to many historical features. The Woodhouse Farmhouse is Grade II listed and dates back to the early 17th century. It currently lies derelict next to the former RAF Rivenhall airfield but we plan to repair the site to its former glory and to keep this valuable piece of heritage alive for future generations. The community is at the heart of everything we do – we strive to create a place we can all treasure for years to come.

On-site Museum

The World War II Squadron Offices were uncovered under years of overgrowth and inside you can find the office of Captain Powell. Following our research we believe Captain Powell was part of the Glider Pilot Regiment, a British Army regiment. We aim to transform elements of this site into a museum - home to preserved artefacts that have been found during the restoration.
